<b>Camp Location:</b>	<b>NaCoMe Camp &amp; Retreat Center</b> 3232 Sulphur Creek Road Pleasantville, TN 37033
<b>Camp Emergency Contact Info:</b>	<p>There is not any cell phone service in the main camp area at NaCoMe, including the cabins and meeting spaces. Attendees are welcome to use the landlines in the Camp Office and the Dining Hall.</p> <p>To reach your camper while they are at Camp NaCoMe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Dining Hall / Kitchen: 931.729.9969 – Best number to call during the day</li> <li>▪ Camp Office: 931.729.9723 – This number is not always monitored</li> <li>▪ For overnight emergencies, call Sam Moore’s (NaCoMe Staff) cell phone: 864.360.4928</li> </ul>
<b>Driving Directions to Camp:</b>	<p><b>I-40 West through Nashville, towards Memphis.</b></p> <p>Take I-40 West to exit 172. Turn left off the exit ramp on to Hwy 46. In 6.5 miles turn right at the traffic light onto Hwy 100. Continue on Hwy 100 through the downtown Centerville square (approximately 18 miles). After another 12 miles you will see a green sign reading “NaCoMe ¼ mile”, then a large NaCoMe sign on the left side of the road. Turn right at the large sign onto NaCoMe Road. Follow 2 miles until you get into camp. The Camp Office will be on the left with the entrance to the office just after the concrete bridge. The main camp entrance is the next right at a wooden NaCoMe sign. Turn right and go across the yellow bridge to get to the main camp area.</p>
CAMP PACKING GUIDE	
<b>What to bring to Camp:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Bed linens: sleeping bag or linens for a twin- or full-size bed (most rooms have one full size bed, and the rest are twin)</li> <li>▪ Personal toiletry items (towels, wash rags, soap, lotion, deodorant, toothbrush &amp; paste, shampoo, etc.)</li> <li>▪ Two (2) pairs of sturdy tennis shoes, with extra pairs of socks. Consider shoes that can get wet (for the creek).</li> <li>▪ Clothes you don’t mind getting dirty</li> <li>▪ Swimming Attire</li> <li>▪ Pajamas</li> <li>▪ Shower shoes (Flip flops serve as great shower shoes.)</li> <li>▪ Sandals and flip flops are not allowed for certain activities (high ropes), so check with your group leader to see if your group will be participating in any of these activities.</li> <li>▪ Flashlight (Optional)</li> <li>▪ Daily medications</li> <li>▪ Bug Repellant &amp; Sunscreen</li> <li>▪ Rain Jacket and/or Light weight Jacket (Camp site can get cool once the sun goes down)</li> <li>▪ An open mind with a spirit of community and fellowship</li> </ul>
<b>What NOT to bring to Camp:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Items of significant value (electronics, jewelry, family heirlooms, etc.). NaCoMe and Foster Chapel are not responsible for lost or stolen items.</li> <li>▪ Shoes and clothing you would not want to get dirty</li> <li>▪ NO food, gum or candy allowed in cabins or that may attract unwanted critters</li> <li>▪ Any items that may damage or stain camp property or buildings</li> </ul>
