to Camp:	Take I-40 West to exit 172. Turn left off the exit ramp on to Hwy 46. In 6.5 miles turn right at the traffic light onto Hwy 100. Continue on Hwy 100 through the downtown Centerville square	
	(approximately 18 miles). After another 12 miles you will see a green sign reading "NaCoMe 1/4"	
	mile", then a large NaCoMe sign on the left side of the road. Turn right at the large sign onto	
	NaCoMe Road. Follow 2 miles until you get into camp. The Camp Office will be on the left with	
	the entrance to the office just after the concrete bridge. The main camp entrance is the next	
	right at a wooden NaCoMe sign. Turn right and go across the yellow bridge to get to the main camp area.
